Psalm 119:105

When we say the Word of God, we are referring to the Holy Bible. The Bible is God's revealed word to mankind. Over the centuries man has tried to change God's word to conform to his way of thinking. Revelation 22:18 says, "I testify to everyone who hears the words of the prophecy of this book: if anyone adds to them, God will add to him the plagues which are written in this book."

It is very important that we always hold to the truth of the Bible and never try to change it or edit what is written. There have been many false teachers that have attempted to change the Word of God thus trying to make right, wrong and wrong, right. Man guided by Satan will try to destroy the credibility and authority of Scripture. As Christians we must never allow this to hinder our faith in the Word of God.

1 Corinthians 2:14-16 says, "But a natural man does not accept the things of the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness to him; and he cannot understand them, because they are spiritually appraised. But he who is spiritual appraises all things, yet he himself is appraised by no one. For who has known the mind of the Lord, that he will instruct Him? But we have the mind of Christ."

The natural, unconverted man cannot understand the things of God. In order to understand spiritual matters, the natural man must be born again and have his spiritual eyes opened.

This verse is talking about heretical groups who are not saved and are false teachers who set out to pollute the Word of God. This verse links in very well with Proverbs 28:5, which says, “Evil men do not understand justice, But those who seek the Lord understand all things.” Romans 8:9 continues, “However, you are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if indeed the Spirit of God dwells in you. But if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, he does not belong to Him.”

As we read in the introduction the Holy Bible was written over a long period of time. One fact we did not read was that the Bible was written by 40 different people. As you can tell God would had to have been behind the writing of the Bible as so many different men and women put pen to paper. The greatest miracle of God here, is that He used all these people in different ways to put the Bible together. Man alone could not write a book and have it agree all the way through. 2 Peter 1:20-21 testifies to this fact. “But know this first of all, that no prophecy of Scripture is a matter of one’s own interpretation, for no prophecy was ever made by an act of human will, but men moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.”
